## **Repect Life**

In his annual budget, Governor Cuomo included a radial bill (S.7511) that would eliminate virtually all limitations on abortion in New York State. It would ensure that abortion is legal through all nine months of pregnancy, for any reason: it would allow for more late-term abortions, even though studies show that the fetus experiences pain at 20 weeks: it would eliminate the law that requires that a baby born alive after an abortion be given adequate health care, even though as many as 5 to 10% of babies in late term abortions are born alive; it would permit non-doctors to do abortions, which would endanger the health of women; and it would eliminate all criminal penalties for abortions - so even if an abortion was against a mothers's will (involuntary or coerced) or if an unborn child is deliberately targeted for an act of violence, it could not be protected. New York State already has far too many abortions. We don't need broader abortion laws. We need out law to respect human life at all stages.

This is particularly dangerous, because the law requires a budget to be passed by April 1<sup>st</sup>. Please contact your state legislators to oppose this extreme bill. The Mass is the greatest prayer known to mankind, but it doesn't always feel that way. Here are a few practices that can help you enter into the Mass with interest and devotion.

7: Offer yourself with the gifts.

When the gifts are brought forward, either from the back of the church or laid on the paten, put yourself beside them. Offer yourself to Jesus with the gifts. Say: "Jesus, I place myself before you with these gifts to be taken up and transformed by your grace."

When the consecration comes, you are no longer just at Mass with people from your neighborhood. So don't just glaze over watching the same old priest raise the same old chalice; see through what is happening to that one sacrifice and offering of Jesus Christ.
